## Week 7 – Nude Food

Its World environment day next Monday 5<sup>th</sup> June and it's a great time to think about ways in which we can care for our planet.

One way to reduce your family's impact on the environment is by packing your kids a lunchbox full of Nude Food.

### **So what is Nude Food?**

Nude food is food without packaging. That means no foil, plastic wrap, plastic or paper bags or commercial packaging. Packing a nude lunch reduces the amount of waste produced, making it a healthier alternative for the planet ☺

### **Tips for packing a nude lunch**

- Buy yoghurt and other prepackaged foods in larger containers and divide into smaller reusable containers.
- Pack reusable cutlery rather than disposable plastic ones.
- Avoid zip lock, plastic and paper bags, plastic wrap and foil.
- Get your kids to help! Involving them in deciding what to take for lunch will help to avoid them throwing it out, leading to reduced waste, which saves the planet and saves money.
- Put a frozen drink bottle or cold pack in with their lunch to keep cold foods, like yoghurt and some sandwich fillings, cold until lunchtime.
- Pack a reusable plastic or metal drink bottle filled with water rather than water in a disposable bottle or tetra packed drinks.

## Hot Lunches


Just a reminder that we **do not** have hot lunches on **Tuesdays**. Wednesdays to Fridays are the only days for hot lunches in the pie warmer.
