### 2019 PARENT PAYMENT CHARGES

#### Essential Education Charges

At the last School Council Meeting, School Fees for 2019 were set. School Fees will remain at \$160.00 per student. These fees are **not voluntary** and everyone is expected to pay. They cover MARC and MACC Fees, student supplies and a computer levy.

Fees can be paid using one of the following options listed below: Essential Education Charges (School Fees) are \$160 per student.
