# **Grip Leadership Conference**

The Gannawarra Shire has organised for the Year 6 students to join a special trip of students from the schools in the Shire to participate in the GRIP Leadership Conference at the Bendigo Stadium on Wednesday 10th May. The GRIP Leadership Conference combines presentations, interactive activities, discussions, leadership games and entertainment to assist students to think about themselves and their leadership role within their school community. Students are required to wear school uniform and bring a packed morning tea, lunch, a drink bottle and a snack to eat on the bus on the way home. Students will attend the conference together on a chartered bus from Lakes Coaches. Gannawarra Shire Council is covering the cost of admission to the conference for all students and staff attending as well as paying for the Lakes Coach. We will be departing Koondrook Primary at 6:15am and returning at around 4.45pm. A permission note will be sent out next term.

# **MARC (Mobile Area Resource Centre) Library News**

#### Term 1

This term we have been looking at caring for library books – **keep them away from food and drinks, put your books in a separate compartment to your drink bottle,** put them up high away from younger siblings and pets, have clean hands when reading, carry carefully and turn pages with care and use a library bag. So many books have been damaged by water accidently spilling on the books or drink bottles leaking in bags. The pages all go crinkly, then go mouldy and need to be thrown out. Please can you enforce this rule at home, as I have already had books returned where a drink bottle leaked in a student's bag. Books are very expensive, please look after them.

Prep, Grade 1 and 2 students have also been looking at the author Craig Smith, who writes the Wonky Donkey series. We have listened to the songs sung by Craig Smith and watched video clips of the songs. We read the book 'Love, Splat' on Valentines Day. We read 'The Wide Mouthed Frog' as well as reading the book 'All the Ways To be Smart' and talked about this at the beginning of the year. We looked at Chinese New Year – The Year of the Rabbit and have completed activities.















The Grade 3,4,5 & 6's looked at the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Ash Wednesday. We read some of the following books 'Burnt Out' (about Ash Wednesday) and 'Bushfire' (about Black Saturday). We talked about the differences between the two devastating fires. We looked at Chinese New Year and made lanterns. We made book marks that the students can use throughout the year. We discussed the Barefoot Investor – Scott Pape's new book for children. We have been looking at David Walliams books. They learnt that he is not only an author, but an actor, comedian and judge on Britain's Got Talent and Australia's Got Talent.
