#### Year 6 Grip Leadership

The Gannawarra Shire has organised for the Year 6 students to join a special trip of students from the schools in the Shire to participate in the GRIP Leadership Conference at the Bendigo Stadium on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> May.

The GRIP Leadership Conference combines presentations, interactive activities, discussions, leadership games and entertainment to assist students to think about themselves and their leadership role within their school community.

Students are required to wear school uniform and bring a packed morning tea, lunch, a drink bottle and a snack to eat on the bus on the way home.

Students will attend the conference together on a chartered bus from Lakes Coaches. Gannawarra Shire Council is covering the cost of admission to the conference for all students and staff attending as well as paying for the Lakes Coach.

We will be departing Koondrook Primary at 6:15am and returning at around 4.45pm.

#### Year 3/4 Camp

Students have the opportunity to participate in a range of activities including: Canoeing, Archery, Orienteering, Low ropes course, Initiative course, Bush cooking, Raft building, Walk to Lake Cooper, and a Night reflector walk. The students will also develop their social skills as they interact with students from their own and other schools in the cluster (Gunbower, Koondrook, Leitchville, and Murrabit).
